Resolution: “A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CONNELLSVILLE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS RECEIVED BY THE CITY OF CONNELLSVILLE UNDER THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP) STATE AND LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (SLFRF); AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF SLFRF FOR REVENUE REPLACEMENT, LEGAL EXPENSES, AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES; AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION AND FILING OF NECESSARY REPORTS; ACKNOWLEDGING THE USE OF SLFRF; AND AUTHORIZING RELATED ACTIONS.”

Resolution: “That proper authorization is given to pay the following expenditures for each and every month for the calendar year 2023: All public utilities, employee benefit premiums; traffic control under \$500.00; police vehicle monthly leases; collection fees from Southwest Regional Tax Bureau; Culligan Water; UniFirst carpets; Pitney Bowes postage; premiums for workmen’s compensation, liability and bonds; gasoline and diesel fuel; animal control; legal advertisements; all contracted maintenance agreements; and monthly retainer fees.”

Resolution: “To increase line item 430.145 "Summer Employees" by \$20,511.00, for salaries of the workers at the Visitors Center for the 2023 summer season. Said monies are from the GO Laurel Highlands Grant.”
